



OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY STATEMENT

The Professional Teachers Council NSW is committed to ensuring the health, safety and welfare of the working environment for its Board members, employees and visitors. All Board, association members and employees of the Professional Teachers Council NSW should regard accident prevention and working safely as a collective and individual responsibility.

In New South Wales, Occupational Health and Safety is regulated under two important pieces of legislation: the NSW Occupational Health and Safety Act 2000, and the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation 2001.

The Board members, employees and visitors of the Professional Teachers Council NSW are required to take reasonable care of themselves and others in the workplace; they must not bypass or misuse systems or equipment provided for Occupational Health and Safety purposes; they must report any unsafe conditions which come to their attention and address these concerns where possible to the PTC NSW Office Co-ordinator or if absent, the PTC NSW Executive Officer.

The Professional Teachers Council NSW Board acknowledges that they have the primary responsibility for the health and safety of those who work under their direction, and participate in the return to work plan of injured employees or visitors.

The Professional Teachers Council NSW Board is committed to conducting regular Occupational Health and Safety consultations with employees and/or their representatives to ensure that Occupational Health and Safety management is of the highest standard.
